Dr. Christopher Khor went to medical school at the National University of Singapore, and went on to train in Internal Medicine and Gastroenterology in Singapore. A Health Ministry scholarship led to an advanced fellowship in ERCP and Endoscopic Ultrasound at the Medical University of South Carolina. After completing the fellowship at MUSC, Dr Khor moved to Indiana University Medical Center to further his training in Endoscopic Ultrasound. Dr Khor's main practice areas are in general gastroenterology, therapeutic endoscopy and pancreato-biliary diseases. His areas of clinical and research interest are in Endoscopic Ultrasound, ERCP, Therapeutic Endoscopy, New Endoscopic Imaging Modalities and Gastric Cancer. He also has an active interest in computer applications in medical practice, and serves as chair of the Mobile Computing Workgroup of the National Healthcare Group. He has a keen interest in endoscopic training and education, and in addition chairs NUH's House Officer Training Committee. Dr. Khor is currently President-Elect of the Gastroenterological Society of Singapore



Ram Chuttani MD practices gastroenterology and internal medicine in Boston and Wellesley Hills, Massachusetts. He graduated with an MD 28 years ago. His current position is the director of the interventional Gastroenterology and Endoscopy at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center. He is famous for all kinds of therapeutic endoscopic and has been involving in many cutting edge technologies in GI endoscopy. He has trained many young advanced endoscopists around the world. His main interest is GI endoscopy in hepatobiliary tract diseases.



Benedict Devereaux is one of the young promising endoscopists from Australia. He received his advanced endoscopic fellowship on EUS and ERCP from Indiana University. He has published research on the role of EUS on cystic pancreatic mass. He is currently a faculty member at Royal Brisbane Hospital and has recently joined the Asian Pacific Endoscopic Master Forum.

Dr. Mitsuhiro Fujishiro is a young and leading endoscopist from Tokyo Medical Center. He has been involved and published in the field of endoscopic submucosal dissection (ESD) and early GI cancer detection. He also has been invited to perform live ESD case to many workshops around the world.



Ryan Ponnudurai acquired his MD from Ireland and certified as American Board of Internal Medicine and Gastroenterology from US. He gained his endoscopic experience from many famous endoscopists, Nib Soehendra and Gregory Haber. His main interest are all kinds of therapeutic endoscopy and EUS. He currently works for Gleneagles Intan Medical Center, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia the advance and referral hospital. He is also held the position as a president of Malaysian Society of Gastroenterology and Hepatology



Dr. Yoshiki Hirooka graduated with PhD from Nagoya University. Although his expertise in GI endoscopy very broad, his main interest is pancreatic cancer and diagnosis. His current project is on immune-cell therapy for locally advanced pancreatic cancer. He has won a lot of awards in GI endoscopy including Matsuo award in 2007.



Dr. Amit Maydeo is presently the Managing Director of the Institute of Advanced Endoscopy at Mumbai, India and is also the Head of the Endoscopy and EUS department of Jeejeebhoy hospital and Research Centre, Mumbai, India. Dr. Amit Maydeo graduated from the Mumbai University in 1980, after which he joined the department of surgery and did his Master of Surgery from the same university in 1984. After finishing his training in GI and Onco-surgery from Mumbai, he worked as a fellow in advanced endoscopy at the University hospital of Hamburg, Germany under Prof. Nib Soehendra in 1986. After his fellowship was completed, he worked as faculty in the University hospital of Hamburg

Dr. Hiroyuki Maguchi is currently the director of Center for Gastroenterology at Teine-Keijikai Hospital from Sepporo Japan. He graduated from Teikyo University School of Medicine in 1983. He is one of the leading experts in ERCP and has published many articles in world leading journals. His recent publication on branch duct IPMN has gained attention from many pancreatologists. He has been invited to perform ERCP in many live demonstration workshops.



In the Department of interdisciplinary endoscopy from 1989 to 1991. After returning to India in 1991, Dr. Maydeo established the SMS endoscopy centre in 1994 and then subsequently the Digestive Disease Centre in 1998. In 2004, Dr. Maydeo was elected to be the President of the Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy of India. In 2003 he established the Institute of Advanced Endoscopy, which is a tertiary referral centre for advanced GI endoscopic work. Dr. Maydeo has done pioneering and extensive work in the fields of esophageal stent placement, therapeutic ERCP and endotherapy of variceal bleeding. Over the last decade Dr. Maydeo did extensive work on pancreatic stone patients in India and presented his work on more than 1000 patients as an oral presentation during the 2004 DDW. Recently his work has been published in Endoscopy related to the technique of treating pancreatic stones. Dr. Maydeo has also been involved in the treatment of difficult CBD stones and has published his original data on balloon sphincteroplasty for removal of difficult stones a few months back. Dr. Maydeo runs an active training centre for advanced endoscopy, advanced ERCP and EUS in Mumbai over the last 15 years.



Dr. Yang Ai-Ming, he graduated medical school and trained in Gastrointestinal specialty in China then got experience in therapeutic endoscopy and EUS with Professor Nib Soehendra in Hamburg, Germany. He has a lot of works in EUS and therapeutic endoscopy. Currently, he is the Professor and Director of Digestive Endoscopic Center, Peking Union Medical College Hospital, Peking, China
